What to do next

Step 1 - Create your photo or short video

Content:	Make a video featuring your medal winner with their ICAS medal answering one of the following questions
	How do you feel about winning an ICAS medal?
	What do you love about ICAS?
	What's your best advice for students sitting ICAS next year?
	Alternatively, take a photo of your medal winner with their ICAS medal and upload this to Facebook. Include their responses to the questions in the caption, or you could take a photo of their written responses!
	As their Principal or teacher, we know you're proud of their achievements too so why not join in and include staff in the video or photo too.
	Staff can also be featured talking about what makes these students stand out or you could try answering one of these questions:
	Why did you want your students to take part in ICAS?
	How does ICAS prepare your students for the future?
	What sets ICAS apart from the other assessments your students take part in?
	What did your students enjoy most about the interactive nature of the ICAS online assessment?
	Videos should be no longer than 58 seconds, so we can share as many students' stories as possible.
Technical requirements:	The optimal image size for photos is 1,200 x 630 pixels. For the best quality, use a JPEG file less than 100 KB in size.
	Video ratio must be 9:16 to 16:9. The video file size must be 4GB max.
Tips:	Position yourself and the students with your face directly toward the natural light or pick a spot with plenty of indoor lighting.
	An uncluttered background will highlight the subject.
	Encourage the student to sit or stand up straight.
	Hold the camera or phone horizontally and make sure the camera is pointed slightly above eye level.
