ICAS celebrates its 40th anniversary with 860 medal winners across ANZ

Celebrating its 40th anniversary in an equally challenging and inspiring year, ICAS Assessments has awarded 860 first-place medals across Australia and New Zealand in 2021.

ICAS is a school-based competition that students from Australia and international schools sit annually across six subject areas – English, Mathematics, Science, Spelling Bee, Writing and Digital Technologies. Owned and operated by Australian edtech company Janison, the prestigious competition is administered in thousands of schools across the globe. Despite COVID’s continuing impact on school education, hundreds of thousands of online tests were completed in 2021.

Students with the top score in each year level, in each subject, are awarded an ICAS medal and a medal winner’s certificate. In Australia, the state by state medal tally was: New South Wales (169), Victoria (151), Queensland (132), SA (101), WA (89), Tasmania (64), ACT (19) and NT (10). New Zealanders received 125 medals.

At ICAS Assessments, our aspiration is to help unlock the potential in every learner, and to recognise and reward their academic excellence.
